## From the Desk of Father Mark:

Greeting and salutations dear children of God! It is my hope and prayer your well being is good, safe and sound.

As September is upon us, this year earmarks the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of 9-11, a day in infamy, when we declared "We will never forget." I remember standing in the living room of our previous rectory, watching the second plane crash into the twin towers in New York City. This day shocked the world as it witnessed such devastating planned terrorist actions in NY, the Pentagon and Pennsylvania. Nearly 3,000 people died from this onslaught and the emptiness of the sky where the Twin Towers were, is always a reminder that freedom has to be vigilant against those wishing to wipe it away. Here at St. Paul's we remember Susan Ancona-Pinto and Joseph Grillo Jr. who died from the collapse of the World Trade Center on 9-11, both being children of parishioners, who have now passed into the Bosom of Abraham and are with each other in the Kingdom of heaven we pray. May their spiritual reunion be that of rejoicing where prior agony and tears once were.

September also brings us an unfortunate renewal in the COVID pandemic; ravaging primarily against those who have been unvaccinated, and even worse, children now have become increasingly more vulnerable to the disease. Last month at a doctor's appointment, my physician told me here in Marion County, he was losing an average of one person a day to the virus. He said that most of them did not have any underlying conditions, and a significant portion of them were under 50 years old and most importantly, every single one of them were unvaccinated. He is on the front lines of this pandemic as his office works with the county Board of Heath Office in attempting to combat this disease. May God bless him and his staff as they remain in harm's way in their service to us. These are the reasons why I keep encouraging everyone to get vaccinated. It has nothing to do with politics or personal freedoms. I respect those, but more and more of the voices defending these principals are no longer here to be heard. And I don't consider their deaths a sacrifice for freedom either. Fear has been the most major component against people protecting themselves with the vaccine. The problem is that the virus is air-borne, so there really isn't any way to completely avoid the air. Simple protections can be utilized to help reduce transmission, but the vaccine is the best protection with the highest rate of success. We all know no vaccine or medicine for that matter is 100 percent risk free, but where would we be without these medicines. If you have any doubts about how a virus can gut the world, remember or research what Small-pox did. Over the fifty-year period of fighting it, Small pox- claimed well over 200 million lives on a planet with way less people to begin with. Some estimates have been as high as 500 million.

We only want the best for one another in our church family. That's what makes us special. We are all praying for the souls we have lost and heaven has gained, and we all pray for the health and protection of those of us carrying on in service to the gospel of Jesus and His Church. We continue to strive to secure and improve our church campus, so that it is pleasing to God and a place we can be comfortable when inviting others to this experience at St. Paul Parish.


